SPRINGS VALLEY COMMUNITY SCHOOLS BOARD OF SCHOOL TRUSTEES SPECIAL BOARD MEETING SEPTEMBER 2, 2020

Executive Session

The Springs Valley School Board met in Executive Session at 5:45 PM on Wednesday, September 2, 2020 in the High School Auditorium. The following were present: Mr. Justin Wininger, Mr. Chris Burton, Mr. Dustin Farris, Mr. Todd Marshall, Mr. Joel Dalton, Mrs. Cheryl Lynch, and Mrs. Jennifer Shipman. Dr. Trevor Apple, Mrs. Renee Childress, Mr. Kyle Neukam, and Ms. Kelly Schmitt were also in attendance.

During the Executive Session, the Board received information about prospective employees, discussed job performance evaluation, collective bargaining, school safety and security, personnel, and litigation. No subject matters were discussed in the Executive Session other than the subject matters specified in the public notice.

Regular Session

The Springs Valley School Board met in Regular Session at 6:55 PM in the High School Auditorium. All board members, Dr. Apple, Mrs. Childress, and Mr. Neukam were present, along with Dr. Jeff Kerby and Mrs. Kathy Allstott.

Mr. Wininger called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance and a Moment of Silence.

No patrons addressed the board.

Dr. Apple presented the Short-Term Closing Expectations Plan for consideration. He stated the plan would be used in the event of a temporary closure, establishing guidelines so families could be aware of what to expect. Dr. Apple then read the Springs Valley Community Schools Short-Term Closing Expectations Plan. He added that meal pickups will be available during a temporary closure, and more information will be provided on that service. Dr. Apple clarified that the recorded lessons will be available the following day for students who cannot access the lessons immediately. This short-term full virtual plan is an addendum to the Back to School Plan previously adopted, and a shut-down would only occur if directed by the county health department or other authority. Teachers and other staff would work their regular work-day onsite as outlined. Mr. Farris made the motion to approve the plan as presented, and Mrs. Lynch seconded. Parents are encouraged to contact the school offices now if they suspect internet problems or poor service so that these issues could possibly be addressed prior to any closing. The Short-Term Closing Expectations Plan was then approved 7-0. (copy attached)
